Programme Feedback Summary

- Allowing more time for interactive discussions and case-based learning.
- Conducting similar programmes periodically for Continuous Medical Education.

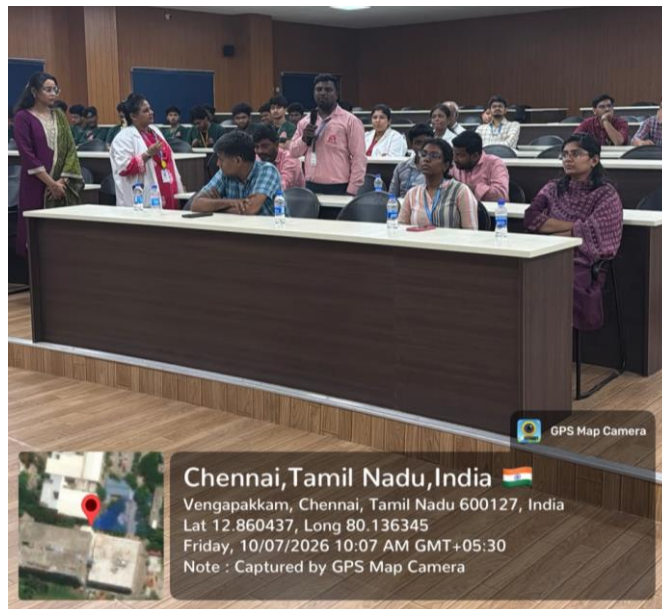
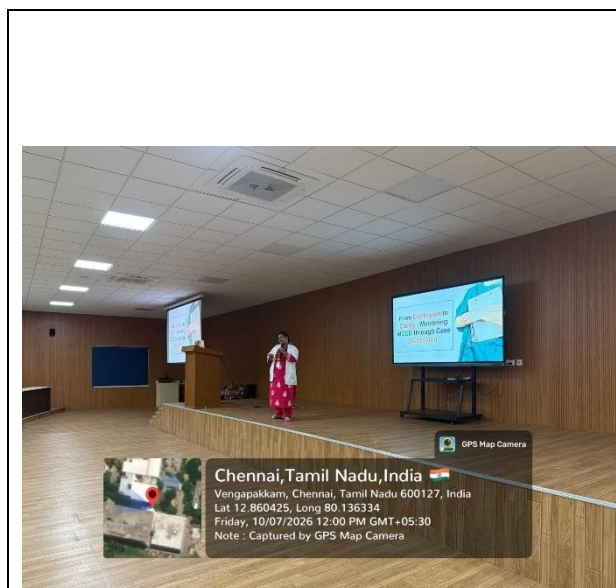
