- **Collaboration:** Strengthened collaboration among healthcare professionals involved in obstetric care, fostering a multidisciplinary approach to managing induced labor.

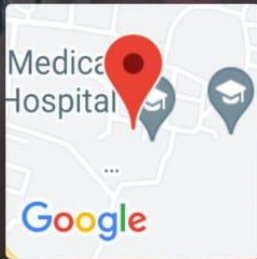
Success Stories:
