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




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Progamme Report:

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

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


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Event Report:

Fire Safety training was conducted by the Central Laboratory - Department of Biochemistry on 1 st August 01.08.2024 at Paediatric Department - Demo Room between 2.30 pm to 3.00 pm to all the faculty, Post graduates & Central Laboratory Technicians of Biochemistry, Microbiology, and Pathology Department by the fire safety officer Mr. Mohan and Mr. Karthik (Fire Safety Department, TMCH)

The training aimed to enhance safety awareness, compliance with fire safety regulations, and emergency response effectiveness. And hands on practice like fire extinguisher operation drills (PASS method: Pull, Aim, Squeeze, Sweep), Overview of different types of fire extinguishers (e.g., water, foam, CO2, dry chemical), Evacuation route walk-through, Roles and responsibilities during a fire emergency and Procedures for reporting a fire and activating fire alarms.

The fire safety training was successful in meeting its objectives Post training assessment was conducted to gauge knowledge improvement. The technician demonstrated a strong understanding of fire prevention, safety equipment, and emergency procedures. Continuous reinforcement of these practices will contribute to a safer working environment and improved readiness in the event of a fire emergency.






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Awareness/Outreach program on Dengue conducted on 25.10.2023 Department of Microbiology

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"CODE BLUE - CME AND WORKSHOP"- 31.01.2024-02-02-2024

A code blue is a hospital emergency code that indicates a patient is in critical condition and needs immediate medical attention. It can refer to a patient, visitor, or employee who is experiencing a lifethreatening medical emergency, such as cardiac or respiratory arrest. Code blue training should be multi-disciplinary, including nursing, anesthesiology, and surgery. Code blue training, such as simulations, can help improve the functioning and efficiency of a hospital's code blue system. This can positively impact patient outcomes. This CME highlights on the importance of CODE BLUE and how to act in a emergency critical life threatening situations. At 10.00 am, Inauguration was commenced with the TAMIL THAI VALTHU followed by a WELCOME ADDRESS by Dr. VINOTH MANI, The HOD (FAC) and organizing secretary, Department of Anaesthesiology, TMCH. Then the dignitaries lightened the Kuthuvillaku followed by the INAUGRAL ADDRESS by Dr.MUTHUKUMARAN, The Dean, TMCH. The first session started around 11.00 am. Dr.BASTINA JENOFFIA explained about ADVANCED CARDIAC Life support emphasizing one preventing cardiac arrest early and continuous high quality CPR with video based real world scenarios which was thoroughly enjoyed and appreciated by the students and faculties. After Lunch break of 1 hour, In the second session around 1.30pm, detailed discussion about ACLS algorithm were discussed by Dr.S.SWAMINATHAN VEERASAMY, Focussing on the reversible causes of cardiac arrest. On the next day, Dr. M.PRAGADEESH RAJA, explained about BRADY AND TACHYARRYTHMIAS IDENTIFICATION AND MANAGEMENT. 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


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
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"INSPIRE IN CME WORKSHOP ON MECHANICAL VENTILATION" 13.07.2024

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
"WORLD ANAESTHESIA DAY" 23.10.2024


