Objective of the program	The primary objective of the event was to educate the public, healthcare professionals, and policy-makers about the Transplantation of Human Organs & Tissues Act , 1994, its significance, legal framework, ethical guidelines, and the impact it has on promoting organ donation and ensuring ethical practices in organ transplantation.		

Report of the program

The event commenced with an address by MEU Co-Ordinator, Dr. D.H. Gopalan, who underscored the significance of Organ Transplantation Awareness Program. The keynote presentation was given by Dr. S. Nandhini, and she explained the provisions of the Transplantation of Human Organs & Tissues Act, 1994, including the regulation of organ donation, the definition of brain death, the process of organ retrieval and transplantation, and the role of authorized transplant centers.

The session emphasized the ethical guidelines established by the Act, such as preventing organ trafficking, ensuring voluntary and informed consent for organ donation, and the regulations for organ allocation based on medical need and urgency. Real-life case studies of successful organ transplants were shared, illustrating the positive impact of the Act in improving organ donation rates, ensuring transparency, and safeguarding patients' rights.

Attendees participated in a Q&A session, asking questions about legal aspects of organ donation, how families can give consent for organ donation, and the procedures for organ allocation and transplantation. Information about how individuals can register as organ donors in compliance with the Act was provided, along with steps for families to follow when faced with brain-dead loved ones.

The program successfully achieved its objective of raising awareness about the Transplantation of Human Organs & Tissues Act, 1994. Participants gained a comprehensive understanding of the legal, ethical, and procedural aspects of organ donation and transplantation. The event helped emphasize the need for transparency, voluntary participation, and informed consent, while also addressing the challenges and opportunities within the field.

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
