	The IEC functions as per the ICMR guidelines and has been registered -		
	Ethics Committee Registration No. ECR/634/Inst/TN2014 issued under Rule		
	122D of the drugs and cosmetics Rule 1945. These research managing		
	committees are integral part of implementation of research, periodic review		
	and monitor the progress of research as per the standard operating procedure		
	of the institution (TMCH-SOP) and shall serve as an overall framework		
	within which research activities may be carried out. The TMCH-SOP serves		
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	as a guideline for all research related activities, in compliance with and

	TMCH has well equipped, climate controlled and power backed up Central
	Research Laboratory (CRL) inaugurated in 2010. This facility occupies an area
	2250 sq. ft providing sufficient bench space for multidisciplinary research. CRL is
	equipped with advanced instruments of cutting edge technology, experienced
	researchers, faculty members and trained technicians. The scope of CRL is to
	support research activities of the Faculty, Ph.D. scholars, postgraduate and
	undergraduate students from all the specialties of institution by providing technical
	assistance and access to advanced and high end scientific instruments. Molecular
	instrumentation facilities includes- PCR, Gel Documentation, Refrigerated
	microfuge, Submarine gel electrophoresis system, UV-viz Bio photometer,
	Biosafety cabinet class II, Sub-zero -80 freezer, Molecular docking and modelling
